#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

O God, you know that we cannot withstand the dangers which surround us. Strengthen us in body and spirit so that with your help, we may be able to overcome the weakness that our sin has brought upon us; through Jesus Christ, your Son our Lord.

### **FIRST READING: Jeremiah 1:4-10, (17-19)**

<sup>4</sup>Now the word of the LORD came to me saying, <sup>5</sup>"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." <sup>6</sup>Then I said, "Ah, Lord GOD! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy." <sup>7</sup>But the LORD said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a boy'; for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you, 8Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, says the LORD." <sup>9</sup>Then the LORD put out his hand and touched my mouth; and the LORD said to me, "Now I have put my words in your mouth. <sup>10</sup>See, today I appoint you over nations and over kingdoms, to pluck up and to pull down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant." <sup>17</sup>But you, gird up your loins; stand up and tell them everything that I command you. Do not break down before them, or I will break you before them. <sup>18</sup>And I for my part have made you today a fortified city, an iron pillar, and a bronze wall, against the whole land—against the kings of Judah, its princes, its priests, and the people of the land. <sup>19</sup>They will fight against you; but they shall not prevail against you, for I am with you, says the LORD, to deliver you.

#### **PSALM: Psalm 71:1-11**

<sup>1</sup>In you, O LORD, I take refuge; let me never be put to shame.

<sup>2</sup>In your righteousness deliver me and rescue me; incline your ear to me and save me.

<sup>3</sup>Be to me a rock of refuge, a strong fortress, to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress.

# <sup>4</sup>Rescue me, O my God, from the hand of the wicked, from the grasp of the unjust and cruel.

<sup>5</sup>For you, O Lord, are my hope, my trust, O LORD, from my youth.

<sup>6</sup>Upon you I have leaned from my birth; it was you who took me from my mother's womb. My praise is continually of you.

<sup>7</sup>I have been like a portent to many, but you are my strong refuge.

<sup>8</sup>My mouth is filled with your praise, and with your glory all day long.

<sup>9</sup>Do not cast me off in the time of old age; do not forsake me when my strength is spent.

 $^{10}$ For my enemies speak concerning me, and those who watch for my life consult together.

<sup>11</sup>They say, "Pursue and seize that person whom God has forsaken, for there is no one to deliver."

#### SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12:31b---13:13

<sup>31</sup>But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way.13If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. <sup>2</sup>And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. <sup>3</sup>If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.<sup>4</sup> Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant <sup>5</sup>or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; <sup>6</sup>it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. <sup>7</sup>It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.8 Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. <sup>9</sup>For we know only in part, and we prophesy

only in part; <sup>10</sup>but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. <sup>11</sup>When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. <sup>12</sup>For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. <sup>13</sup>And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

#### **GOSPEL:** Luke 4:31-44

<sup>31</sup>He went down to Capernaum, a city in Galilee, and was teaching them on the sabbath. <sup>32</sup>They were astounded at his teaching, because he spoke with authority. <sup>33</sup>In the synagogue there was a man who had the spirit of an unclean demon, and he cried out with a loud voice, <sup>34</sup> Let us alone! What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." 35But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" When the demon had thrown him down before them, he came out of him without having done him any harm. <sup>36</sup>They were all amazed and kept saying to one another, "What kind of utterance is this? For with authority and power he commands the unclean spirits, and out they come!" <sup>37</sup>And a report about him began to reach every place in the region. <sup>38</sup>After leaving the synagogue he entered Simon's house. Now Simon's mother-in-law was suffering from a high fever, and they asked him about her. <sup>39</sup>Then he stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. Immediately she got up and began to serve them. <sup>40</sup>As the sun was setting, all those who had any who were sick with various kinds of diseases brought them to him; and he laid his hands on each of them and cured them. <sup>41</sup>Demons also came out of many, shouting, "You are the Son of God!" But he rebuked them and would not allow them to speak, because they knew that he was the Messiah. 42At daybreak he departed and went into a deserted place. And the crowds were looking for him; and when they reached him, they wanted to prevent him from leaving them. <sup>43</sup>But he said to them, "I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other cities also; for I was sent for this purpose." <sup>44</sup>So he continued proclaiming the message in the synagogues of Judea.
